Relevant axis of Bachelor international relations

A Bachelor's in International Relations is a degree program that explores the political, economic, and social relations among states, as well as non-state actors. Some relevant axis that may be included in such a program are:

Introduction to International Relations: This axis provides an overview of the foundational concepts and theories in international relations, including the study of power, institutions, and globalization.
