Master: Literary Studies - Arabic Literature - Linguistic Studies


As for the LMD doctoral training, two are offered in the field of Arabic language and literature:

THE LMD SYSTEME IN ALGERIA

The architecture of the LMD system is based on 3 degrees: LICENCE - MASTER - DOCTORATE.

Courses are organized into semesters and credit-bearing teaching units (UE).

Implementation of the credit system

The Semester

- ▶ The semester is the periodic duration of training units: the basic unit of training is therefore no longer the academic year but the semester.
- ► The three training cycles are expressed in semesters Bachelor's degree: 6 semesters

Master's degree: 4 semesters

Doctorate: 6 semesters

- ► The semester corresponds to an established hourly volume measured in credits.
- ▶ All the units in a semester add up to 30 credits.

▶ Thus

1 st cycle = Licence corresponds to 180 credits

2 nd cycle = Master 120 credits

3 rd cycle = Doctorate

► Semesters comprise a defined number of weeks: 1 semester = 15 weeks (teaching + assessment).

Semester and Credits

Teaching Unit (UE)

- ► Basic unit of a training pathway = autonomous and coherent subdivision within a study program
- ► Teaching method:

Lecture, tutorial, practical, fieldwork, research, etc.

- or a combination of these forms.

 ▶ Its value is defined in credits.
- ► It is codified and numbered.
- ► Mode of validation and promotion :

Obtain the required average for the UE

Capitalize on all UE required to obtain diploma or degree

Credit

- ▶ Unit determining the value of a UE and the total workload (CTT) required to achieve the UE's objectives. 600 hours of CTT for the student
- i.e. a maximum of 360 hours of face-to-face teaching / semester (exceptionally 420H)

face-to-face teaching = 30 hours / week maximum (exceptionally 35H)

Admission Process

The Algerian Ministry of High Education and Scientific Research has set up an enrollment platform for international students called "PROGRES": https://progres.mesrs.dz/webetrangers/index.xhtml;jsessionid=A5DCE3EEF1D955FCEC1C2C1688085D94

That will enable all person to find out about the teaching process at Algerian universities, choose a course of study and register.

The admission process for international students at Djilali Bounaama Khemis Miliana University typically involves the following steps:

- 1. Application: International students must first submit an online application in the platform of PROGES. The application typically includes personal information, academic transcripts, and any other relevant documents requested by the university.
- 2. Evaluation: Once the application is received, the Vice rectorate in charge of PEDAGOGY will evaluate the student's academic qualifications and determine whether they meet the admission requirements for the chosen program of study.
- 3. Admission Decision: The university will notify the student of their admission decision, which may be conditional or unconditional. If the admission is conditional, the student will need to meet certain requirements, such as providing additional documentation or passing a language proficiency exam, before being fully admitted.
- 4. Enrollment: Once admitted, the student will be required to enroll in the faculty and pay any applicable fees. They may also need to obtain a student visa and satisfy other immigration requirements.


